Coonawarra & Limestone Coast Wines revealed

Our welcome wine was some of the club Shiraz accompanied by 'old style' cheese, metwurst and biscuits provided by Peter Frick. Our numbers were down a bit as many (including some of our key players) were away. This meant Ian Cooper took over as our MC for the evening. He welcomed everyone and introduced Simon Granfield to present some wines of south eastern South Australia.

Simon told us we would be tasting the wines in pairs and each pair would be of the same variety (but not necessarily the same variety as another pair). Ian & Simon poured the wines and we smelled sipped, dis-



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cussed and recorded our conclusions on the sheets provided. Once all the wines were tasted it was time for the big reveal! The first pair were actually Malbec. This region does not produce much Malbec so many of us were fooled. The actual wines were: Number 1 2018 Katnook Estate Malbec which was from Coonawarra and number 2, 2022 Reschke R-Series Malbec from Lucindale.

The second pair of wines were Shiraz; 2021 Stonehaven Limited Vineyard Release Padthaway Shiraz (3) and (4) 2022 Bowen Estate Shiraz from Coonawarra.

Our final pair were Cabernet Sauvignons. Number 5 was a 2019 Majella Cabernet Sauvignon from the Coonawarra and our sixth wine was a 2021 Stonehaven Limited Vineyard Release Padthaway Cabernet Sauvignon.

There was no definite agreement over what was the 'wine of the night', however the final wine seemed to get the most votes. Our roast pork arrived while Simon was finishing his presentation and it was followed by an ice-cream sundae.

Door prize winners were George Akkerman, Laurie Rundle and Dagmar Keady who were offered a choice of one of Simon's Limestone Coast wines or one from our cellar. Ian rounded off the night thanking Simon for his presentation and reminding everyone that we would be back in the Red Room for a presentation by Reillys (from Clare) next month.

1. 2018 Katnook Estate Malbec

2 2022 Reschke R-Series Malbec

This rich Malbec displays aromas of dark jammy fruits with flavours of blackberry and red plum. Hints of vanilla spice and chocolate support this full-bodied wine that is ready for immediate enjoyment.

3 2021 Stonehaven Limited Vineyard Release Padthaway Shiraz

This Shiraz is a velvety-rich and smooth wine. Lingering scents of dark cherry and olive, paired with bright red berries and pepper spice on the palate complete this wine for a lasting impression.

4. 2022 Bowen Estate Shiraz

An extremely pleasing, lifted medium weight Shiraz. On the palate this wine exhibits classic plum and ripe raspberry fruit notes that are typically Shiraz. Lovely fresh oak tannins are intrinsically woven with the fruit to seamlessly add length and breadth. A hall-mark of our wine is balance and this wine shows this even in its current youth - giving great cellaring potential. A delight to drink now or put away in the cellar.

5. 2019 Majella Cabernet Sauvignon

The wine is dark magenta in colour, with a deep ruby red hue. Mint, eucalypt, dark fruit with savoury, toasty aromas are paired with a fresh, structured palate of mint and cassis supported by classic mulberry and plum characters. Fine tannins and good length.

6. Stonehaven Limited Vineyard Release Padthaway Cabernet Sauvignon 2021

This Cabernet Sauvignon is full bodied with generous dark fruit. With an elegant nose of cassis, this wine has blackberry and dark chocolate on the fore, followed by pepper spice and integrated vanillin oak for a complex and lengthy finish.

batch fermentation with a 16 day maceration and then 18 months in French oak hogsheads. Dark maroon hue. There are notes of black fruits, aniseed, chocolate, tobacco leaf, spices and cedar. A flick of vanilla too from the oak, well integrated. This is impressively structured with good balance and excellent length. Showing fine tannins, the wine is youthful, promising and already exhibiting a touch of complexity. Lots of blackberries on the palate with hints of soy. Drink for six to ten years.
